Our Story



ADVOCATING FOR SEX TRAFFICKING

Sex trafficking is the exploitation of a person by means including coercion or deceit to engage in commercial sexual activity, prostitution, exotic dancing, or pornography. When the victim is a minor under the age of 18 years old, sex trafficking does not require force or coercion. Minors cannot legally consent to sexual activity. We brought awareness to human trafficking by standing in the gap through a silent protest against Human Sex Trafficking where 16 commissioned HPD officers and 15 volunteers participated without incident on Bissonnet Street and at a juvenile detention center after dark each week during Human Sex Trafficking Month.

BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

HOH empowers people around the globe to be the best version of themselves, whether it be physically or mentally. In 2020, we led an initiative to spread hope to individuals thriving through breast cancer treatment. This national endeavor reached six different states, including: California, Texas, Connecticut, Michigan, Missouri, and Georgia. HOH volunteers delivered balloons, cards, and encouragement notes to Brest Cancer Centers and hospital nationwide. HOH even took the time out to visit The Rose, which is a clinic that services uninsured patients with their breast cancer treatment needs. We were able to provide lunch for office and medical staff as well as balloons as a gift of gratitude for them helping one of our own who overcame the disease in 2019.



SERVICE . OUTREACH. EMPOWERMENT.

We dared to believe that we could impact the globe with hope! Our organization operates on three principles, we identify as pillars: Service, Outreach, and Empowerment. We served the homeless with home prepped meals, partnered with other organizations to help with food drives, Serving food and honoring a Ministry with delicious lunch and a proclamation naming a day in their honor. Outreach extended to communities by serving lunch bags, dessert, and hand sanitizer and prayer, Additonally, We donated a commercial chainsaw to the nationally recognized Relief Gang to help with clean up in Louisiana after Hurricane Laura, empowering others with scholarships for school, starting an online teaching academy and telehealth medical clinic. These are moments that we celebrate and hold dear to our hearts. We believe in being the hands, and feet of the kingdom and will continue to be so.









Service

- 100 handwritten cards of encouragement delivered to healthcare workers
- Served gratitude luncheon to 70 workers and volunteers at nationally known Arrow Child & Family Ministries who provide housing for children escaping sex trafficking and awaiting adoption
- Handed out 100 bottles of water, 200 masks, and 50 snack packages at March for George Floyd and national unrest in Downtown Houston
- 200lbs of food given to senior citizens at Houston area apartment community. 45 individuals also received food weekly over the next 90 days.
- 400 toiletry bags prepared and passed out to transient population nationally
- 100 letters were drafted and mailed to encourage prisoners in the TDCJ system
- 600 hot, hearty, healthy meals were prepared and served to homeless and assisted living communities
- 750 families in Angleton, Rosharon, Pearland, and Houston received groceries (fresh produce, meat, nonperishable food items) through a connection with a partnership with a Houston Food Bank grant recipient
- \$500 donation to nationally recognized Relief Gang to purchase a chainsaw to aid with Hurricane Laura clean up
- \$350 donation to Windsor Village Back to School Rally which provided supplies for 20 students and 2 laptop computers

- Attended Houston Area Pastors: Pray, Stand and Unite at Houston City Hall. We were given the opportunity to fellowship with spiritual leaders from Lakewood Church, Grace Church, and other Houston area assemblies
- Established online pharmacy to meet the need in the community
- Established Hope Over Hurt Clinic, which provided telehealth medical visits
- Soft launch of Hope Leadership Academy to assist with online tutorials


2020 BUDGET PERFORMANCE
